What is the news story that links Baroness Hallett to Boris Johnson?

Baroness Hallett required that Boris Johnson should disclose unredacted versions of WhatsApp messages exchanged during the pandemic.

The Cabinet Office that the WhatsApp messages were not relevant. Disclosing the messages could discourage ministers from discussing matters on WhatsApp and using other digital communications.

Boris Johnson has said that he will give unredacted messages to the Covid Inquiry.

This is a battle between the inquiry that wants transparency and the government that is raising matters of privacy.
